he Crater Foundation Newsletter is once again proud to present a graduate of Crater High School who has made a difference in the world. It is our pleasure to publish this article and update the many friends of 1975 graduate Jan Harris Lynch.

Jan recently retired after 28 years as Executive Director of the Grand Teton Association, a large educational non-profit in Grand Teton National Park and Jackson Hole, Wyoming.

After two years in the Business Administration program at Southern Oregon University, Jan left school and began working for Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company in Portland where she spent the next 7 years and became one of the first women store managers in the country.

In 1984 Jan married Frank Lynch, a National Park Service employee, and moved to Yellowstone National Park with Frank and their newborn son. They lived in a remote part of Yellowstone with no phones and only bears and moose to keep them company. In 1988, right before the Yellowstone fires, they moved with the National Park Service to Grand Teton National Park, Colter Bay. After the birth of her 2nd son, Kiel, she took a job with the Association. She tells us, "I was fortunate enough to eventually become the Executive Director, increasing sales from \$500 k to over \$4.3 million when I retired in July 2017. My position enabled me to run interpretive stores for the Park, Forest and the National Elk Refuge inside of visitor centers with the proceeds benefiting the educational, interpretive and research efforts of these Federal agencies." She was project manager for the many books GTA published, she was part of the design team for the state of the art Craig Thomas Discovery Center, over-saw Plein Air for the Park, and administered the Jenny Lake Ranger Fund. She goes on to tell us, "living and working in a national park and supporting our

public lands has been my life's work. It was a dream job!"

Jan is very proud of sister, Sherrel Harris Johnston, class of '71 who has lived in Oklahoma for over 40 years, owns her own



gymnastic gym, and recently received the State of Oklahoma Shannon Miller Coach of the year award!

Recently Jan and Frank purchased a home in the Boise area to be closer to their family and friends and are enjoying retirement. She tells us, "I go to visit my best friend, Debbie Saxbury, as often as I can. It is really fun that my grade school, and other best friend, Jakki Wright and her family live and own businesses in the town we now live in, Meridian Idaho.

In their free time they volunteer for a veteran's organization, Wyakin Foundation, helping injured and ill veterans transition back to civilian life and careers through mentoring and education. Jan is also a hospice volunteer in Boise.

#### SPRING STATE PLAYOFFS RESULTS

**Crater Girls Basketball** - the lady Comets made it to the eight team State Tournament but were defeated in the first two games by LaSalle of Portland and Central High School of Monmouth. They finished the season with a 21 – 6 record.

**Crater Boys Basketball** – the boys' also made it to the eight team State Tournament. They won their first game against South Albany but lost their next two games to state champion Thurston and to Churchill and finished 6th. They finished the season with a 25 – 3 record.

#### SPRING RESULTS

**STATE CHAMPIONS - Baseball** — The Comet baseball team finished the season 2nd in the Midwestern League and proceeded to the state playoffs where they were ranked 3rd in the state. They defeated Hillsboro 11– 5 in the first round of state playoff games and then faced Sandy in the state quarter finals. They defeated Sandy 1 – 0 in eight innings with pitcher Larson Kindreich pitching a no hit game striking out 20 hitters. The Comets then faced Bend in the state semi-final game and defeated them 5 – 4 to reach the state 5A championship game for the second year in a row. Crater faced the top seeded Crescent Valley team of Corvallis in the state title game and defeated them 2 – 0. Their season record is 25 – 6.

**Softball** – The Crater girls' softball team finished 4th in the Midwestern League and proceeded to the state playoffs where they defeated Silverton 8 - 4 in a play in game. They then defeated Dallas 2 - 1 in the first round of state playoff games. They then advanced to a quarter finals game against Putnam and were defeated 5 – 3 to end their season. Crater's girls finished the season with a 13 -12 record.

**Boys Track** – The Crater boys track team finished 2nd in the District meet and 5th at the State Track and Field meet. Crater had one State Champion, senior Cal Duke who repeated as the Intermediate hurdles state champion with a state record performance and finished 2nd in the 110 meter high hurdles. Other top placers were junior Jantz Tostenson with a second in the 3000 meter run and sophomore Ryland McCullough finishing 3rd in the 800 meter run.

**Girls Track** – The Crater girls track team finished 5th at the district meet and 17th at the state track meet. Ariana Marks finished 8th in the 3000 meter run and 6th in the 1500 meter run while Emily Thompson finished 3rd in the pole vault.

Girls Golf - The Crater girls golf team qualified for the State tournament and finished 3rd at the state.

**Boys Golf** - The Crater boys golf team did not qualify any players for state tournament matches.
